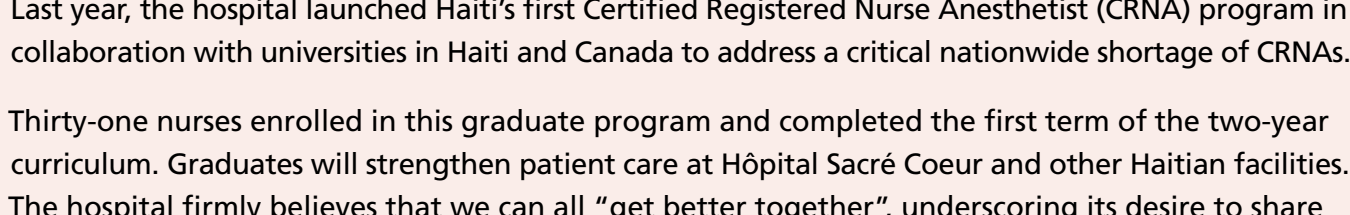

Students in Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist (CRNA) Begin Second Term

Last year, the hospital launched Haiti's first Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist (CRNA) program in collaboration with universities in Haiti and Canada to address a critical nationwide shortage of CRNAs.

Thirty-one nurses enrolled in this graduate program and completed the first term of the two-year curriculum. Graduates will strengthen patient care at Hôpital Sacré Coeur and other Haitian facilities. The hospital firmly believes that we can all "get better together", underscoring its desire to share its progress with the nation for the people's benefit. ■



Volunteer Veterinary Student Learns and Teaches at HSC Farm

In early January, I had the privilege of volunteering at the hospital's new farm. Dr. Zouein, DVM, a faculty member at St. George's University School of Veterinary Medicine, and I embarked on our first trip to Haiti to improve productivity on the farm and make food more accessible to Milot. **Before arriving in Haiti, I wasn't sure what to expect, given the worrisome media reports. In reality, I found Milot to be a safe, welcoming, and peaceful town filled with natural beauty.**



Our plan included educating farm workers on proper biosecurity practices, introducing proper nutrition for the livestock, and implementing a future breeding plan to select for more productive genetics. Additionally, we administered vaccines, created a registry of identified animals, and assessed the overall health of the herd.

At first, I stood to the side, watching the farm workers struggle to lasso and wrangle each cow for examination and vaccination. To avoid unnecessarily stressing the cows, Dr. Zouein introduced a herding method in which we moved in a circle to guide the cows into the chute for restraint. This approach was far more successful and less strenuous for the workers. **From**

handwashing to breeding soundness exams, I found the farm workers eager to learn about our proposals and quick to apply our suggestions.

As a veterinary student, I found assisting Dr. Perez, a full-time veterinarian at the farm, and Dr. Zouein incredibly rewarding. I deepened my education by applying classroom concepts to real-world assessments and planning. In every

interaction, I navigated cross-cultural and linguistic communication, which further strengthened my

adaptability to the challenges of veterinary medicine. I hope our impact can shape future procedures on the farm and bring abundance to the area. I would be grateful for the opportunity to return to Milot in the future to see the progress the farm has made. ■

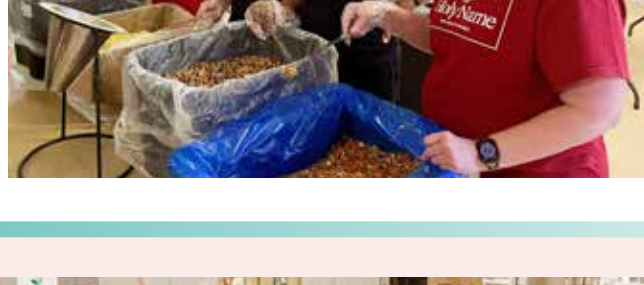

Peace Ministries Packs 30,000 Meals During Their Team-Building Event.

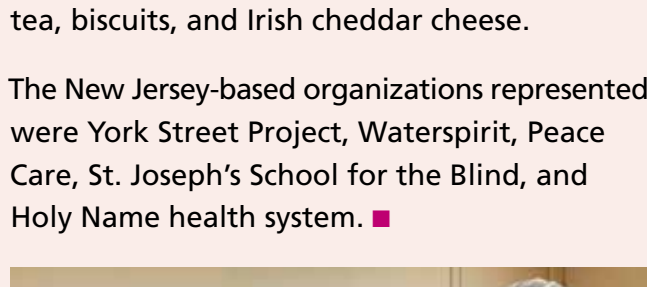

The New Jersey-based organizations represented were York Street Project, Waterspirit, Peace Care, St. Joseph's of the Blind, and Holy Name health system. ■



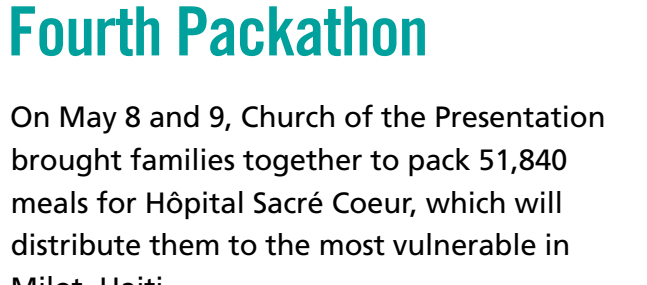

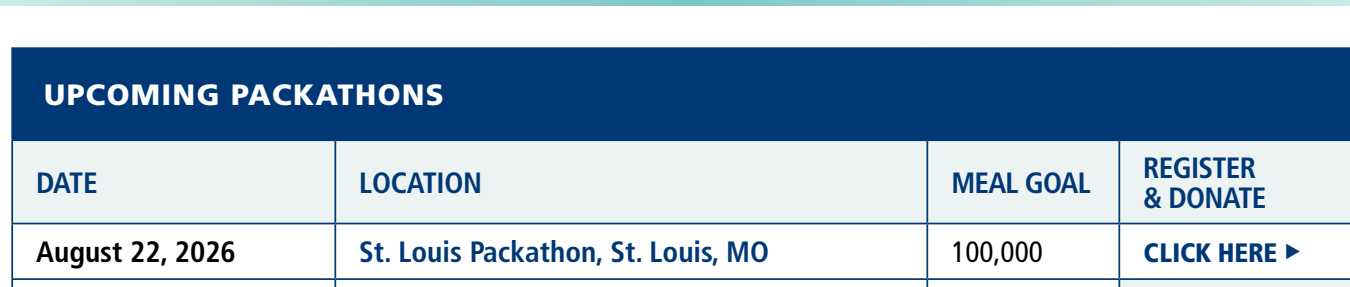

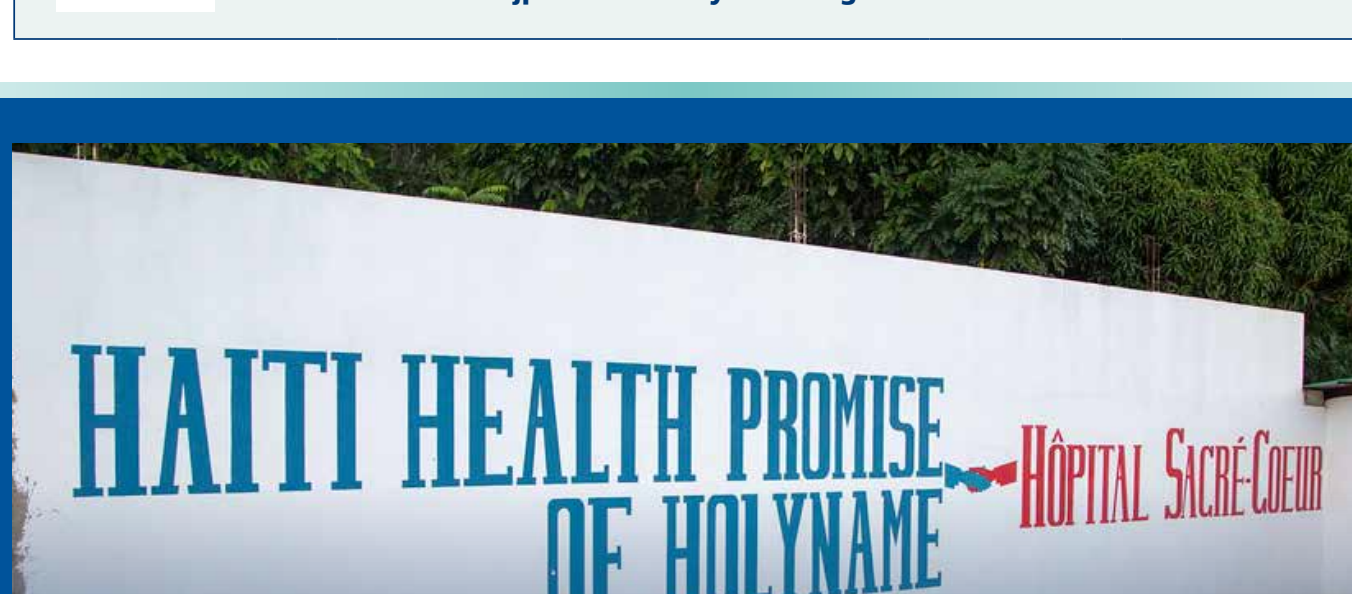
